## 1. AGM Review

Financials are in order & the review engagement has been done.

## 2. Update Directors/Officers form for Societies.

- Three new directors have joined. David Musselwhite, Barbara Curtis, Sonia Watson.
- Kim Friedenberg will remain as President, Tara Cripps will remain as Secretary. Adam Cripps will be our new Treasurer.

### 3. Fundraisers

- Grocery bagging dates are set for November 27 (today), December 24<sup>th</sup> and January 21-22, 2017. Superstore has imposed stricter rules around which groups get to grocery bag as well as expectations from the groups. These are all rules we have already established so there aren't really any concerns on our end. All scheduling is to be done through Vanessa at Superstore. Tara to confirm our January dates and get another date or two for February. Tara will also confirm the expectations so we aren't caught off guard.
- Purdy's Christmas campaign has increased in \$2000 is gross sales this year. We have also been informed that other groups in town are also doing well with sales so it is starting to get competitive. We need to step up our game for future campaigns.
- Raven Recycling continues to receive donations on our behalf. We have made over \$300 this past year.
- Coffee, Tea & Spice fundraiser didn't do as well this year. Only profited around \$200. Donna is ok to continue doing the fundraiser though in the future. 20 extra 1lb bags have also been ordered to sell at the Christmas concerts in December.
- Coat check at the High Country Inn for the Yukon Hospital Corporation Christmas party is scheduled for December 10<sup>th</sup>. There appears to be a lot of interest in this fundraiser as most of the slots have been signed up for. Tara/Adam will be co-ordinating the students with set up and tear down and will monitor throughout the evening. The brass band has also acknowledged that they will be playing music sometime between 5:30 and 7:00.

### 4. Sponsorship and Grants

- Elks has provided us with a \$1000 donation for Dec concerts
- Alpine Veterinary Medical Centre has provided us with a \$250 donation for Dec concerts
- Youth Investment Fund has provided us with a \$4500 donation for the Jazz Band community tour. (Travellers may have to pay a small fee to travel this year.)

- Parks & Recreation has provided us with a \$700 donation to go towards next year's Christmas concert.
- **Jennifer** has contacted Air North for donations to our Silent Auction in February.
- **Adam** has volunteered to take the lead for the Sponsorship Committee. He will also contact Gold Corp for possible sponsorship.

## 5. Christmas Concert

- Adam has volunteered to introduce the bands at the beginning of the concerts.
- **59** tickets have been sold online for the first night. 43 tickets have been sold for the 2<sup>nd</sup> night. We need to do more promotion in the next newsletter.

## 7. Trip Update

Zip-lining and clinics are planned for Saturday. A Vancouver Music Academy concert is planned for Sunday afternoon. Monday's plan is to tour the Purdy's factory followed by shopping at Metrotown and fly home late in the evening.

- Adam has volunteered to do sound for the Jazz Band and Big Band.
