### 1. Finances

- **Directors Insurance** paid for the year. \$600 again.
- **AOF & projected budget** Paul, Jenn and Keith have spent countless hours on the paperwork giving a representation of how we operate to the committee.

AOF is our main funding source. Our funding has dropped from \$20,000 down to \$16,000. Since they fund groups that perform, they need to know what the benefit is to the community. We had to rebalance the funds to divide the Administrative costs into Production specific categories and therefore reduce the amount that's truly spent on admin duties.

Jenn has created a spreadsheet outlining detailed expenses with donations in kind which was distributed to the group for review and approval.

### Fundraisers

- i. **Grocery Bagging** happening at Superstore today. Participation has been low this year. Most excuses tend to be due to work conflicts. We need to tighten up who gets to supervise. Typically, the parent volunteers should be given priority to sign up over Adult members as the rates are different.
- ii. **Purdy's** March 15<sup>th</sup> is the due date for Easter Purdy's orders.

### 2. Christmas Concert review

- **Canadian Heritage Grant** artist payment amount \$13,248. This worked out to be about \$46 per member per performance.
- **Passport pricing** received positive feedback from the community especially those with larger families.

- Many volunteers helped with set up and tear down which made for a great experience overall. It was suggested that it would be handy to have a separate drum kit ready to go for the jazz band and perhaps have it on its own riser so that can be quickly moved on and off stage. This is to be considered further if it would be of value.
- **Action item** Bill/Adam to look into having a moving riser donated

## 3. Whistler Trip

- **Air North** 40% off sale was utilized to purchase the flights to Vancouver. This has significantly reduced the total cost of the trip.
- **Itinerary** New draft of the itinerary was quickly reviewed.
